
## Committee Reports

Founded in 1940 by a group of women who cared about the Lititz Community and building strong bonds, today the Lititz Woman's Club boasts over 150 members and continues to raise funds in support of the Lititz Community. All proceeds from this tournament will go toward the support of women, children, and families in Lititz.

This tournament is called a "gentle" tournament because it was established to give new Mah Jongg players an opportunity for tournament play. The games are not timed and positive comments and gentle help is encouraged during play.

Price includes lunch, morning pastries and dessert, coffee, tea, and water. Other drinks may be purchased from the pub.

A minimum of 24 players will be required. We will register by tables of four; you do not have to make up your own table. As registrations arrive, tables will be formed. There will be a total of 12 tables; once full registrations will be held on a substitute list. Each player will be sent a packet with tournament rules, table assignment, and instructions for the day. Because we are creating tables of four, it is important that we have no "no shows" on the day of the tournament. <u>If for any reason you cannot play, secure a replacement</u>.
